

COINS FROM SAMARIA-SEBASTE

Introduction*:




Fig. 1. Plan of Sameria - Sebaste (after Crowfoot SSI)

From October 1965 to 6 June 1967, the Department of Antiquities conducted an intensive programme of excavations and clearance at Samaria-Sebaste, which had remained untouched since the work of the Joint Expedition in 1932-35.¹ The new project was financed by U.S. Agency for International Development and was supervised by the late Paul W. Lapp of ASOR. On the Jordanian side, the staff consisted of F. Zayadine as archaeologist-in-charge with Hifzi Haddad and Hussein Qandil as assistants. Mr. Rudy Dornemann replaced Dr. Lapp during the fall of 1966. Because the project aimed at the development of the site for tourism, the excavation programme included the reopening of the old trenches and the completion of the previous excavations. The crew, which was gradually raised from 25 to 200 men, extended the work from the Theater to the Colonnaded Street, the West Gate and the Augustus Temple (Fig. 1).

Unfortunately the war interrupted the project and only short reports were published.² F. Zayadine remained for a few months at the Ecole Biblique of Jerusalem after the war and published an Iron Age Tomb.³ He was able to salvage the objects, including the coins.

A short account of the progress of excavations will certainly help place the collection in its archaeological and architectural context, but it is at present impossible to publish the sections and the detailed description of the excavated monuments. It is hoped that in future it will be possible to publish the large amount of pottery, especially the important collection of Rhodian jar-handles.

The **Theater**, which is built into the northern slope of the tell (Figs. 1-2 and Pl. L,1), was discovered, partly excavated and filled back by the Joint Expedition in 1932. This small monument in its present state belongs to the building operations of Septimius Severus at the beginning of the third century AD. as indicated by two Corinthian capitals from the back wall of the stage. But this late theater took the place of an earlier one probably built by Herod the Great (37-4 BC) for we discovered during consolidation that most of the substructures of the actual seats are in fact smaller seats belonging to a previous theater. A sounding dug in the orchestra showed unfortunately no traces of an earlier phase. The theater was ruined in the late fourth or early fifth century AD : some of its granitic columns were taken to the upper church of St. John the Baptist and

a lime soil very rich in coins of the 4th and 5th century was laid over the orchestra. Since the monument was very poorly preserved, the Joint Expedition was lucky to discover the stairway still standing in the fifth *cuneus*. Nevertheless, it was in the upper storey that we encountered new and attractive features: in this area three successive walls were exposed, and they will be described from south to north (Fig. 1):

The City Walls :

The innermost defensive wall is the Hellenistic Fort Wall (Fig. 1, 11 which is four metres wide and was built with undressed stones. It ran parallel with the Israelite lower wall of the 9th-8th century BC which averages 3.60m in width and was characterized by its technique of well-dressed headers and stretchers. The Hellenistic round tower of the 4th century BC was built into this wall. But one of our most interesting but puzzeling discoveries was a massive wall (12) about 5.50m wide, which thickens the lower Israelite wall. It was constructed mainly with headers of 1.0m x 0.30m; its northern face (Wall D) was restored during the excavations. The foundation trench of this imposing wall provided pottery of the Late 8th century, including Assyrian bowl rims. Thus, the new structure was related to the rebuilding operation of Sargon II, after the sack of the city in 721 BC, as stated in his Annals.⁴ A segment of this wall was excavated by the Joint Expedi-

tion and vaguely identified as "pre-Hellenistic"⁵, because of their limited sounding.

The above-mentioned headers were largely robbed in many places to erect the Hellenistic tower, and it was in the robbing pits that interesting finds were recovered: a group of Early Hellenistic pottery⁶ appeared in trench V, Sq. 12:5; a late 4th century BC "Achaemenid"-type gold double-daric⁷ (Pl. L,2) weighing 16mg was discovered in trench III, Sq.21. In trench II, Sq.56:6 a silver drachma, dated to c.425 BC, came to light (Catalog No. 1 = S247). Several bronze coins of Ptolemy I (304-282 BC) and Ptolemy II (285-246) were found N° s. 13-51). The Seleucid occupation of Palestine is also very well attested: there are 33 coins (n°s 58-90) of Antiochus III the Great (223-187 BC) who captured Samaria from Ptolemy IV in 189 BC.

the Colonnaded Street which is about 900m long, runs along the southern slope and links the West Gate with the Forum and the East Gate, probably near the cathedral of St. John the Baptist. This main access to the city was lined on both sides by mono-shaft columns, 4.50m high, still standing in the olive trees. A large trench of 50m x 15m was dug down to the original floor. Sporadic flagstones were encountered, for this commercial artery -- certainly in use during the Hellenistic period -- was invaded in Byzantine times by poor and rather ugly little shops, the floors of which were very rich in coins of the 4th century AD. A thick




Fig. 2. Restored Plan of Theater (S.S.I, p. 58). The excavated trenches are I-V.

layer of burning marks the end of the early Byzantine occupation and this disaster was associated with the Samaritan revolt⁸ in 529 AD or with the 551 earthquake.⁹ Some coins (N°s 335-377) attributed to Constans II (641-668 AD) provide the evidence of the latest Byzantine occupation. After the Muslim Conquest, the area was used for agricultural purposes. Retaining walls crossed the whole excavated trench from east to west, and some Umayyad falūs (N°s 338-40) were found, including one of 'Abd-al-Malik ibn Marwan (685-705). Other Arab coins belong to the Abbasid period (N° 341) and, the latest, to the Mamluk rule (N°s 342-44).

At the West Gate, the programme included the removal of the old excavation dumps, which obscured the Herodian walls, and the digging of a new control trench near the south round tower. The trench, which reached bedrock, revealed a stratigraphy from the Byzantine period down to the Iron Age II. A quarry was exposed at the deepest level, associated with 9th century BC sherds. The ear-

liest coins, those of Ptolemy I (N°s. 14 and 15), were found in Sq. 6:3 and 14:6, which is the lowest Hellenistic layer. Several Seleucid coins of Demetrius II (130-125 BC) and Alexander II (128-123 BC) were found; while a Byzantine coin of Constantine II (337-361) marks the latest occupation of the site.

When the June war broke out, we were in the process of clearing the courtyard of the temple at the summit, erected by Herod the Great, in honor of his protector, the emperor Augustus and restored in the Severan period. The Idumean king renamed the city "Sebaste" (=Augusta), after his friend, and rebuilt its walls and monuments on a large scale about 25 BC. According to Josephus,¹⁰ Herod "thought of making a third rampart (after the Antonia and the royal palace in Jerusalem) against the entire "nation out of Samaria." The city played a major role in the brilliant but cruel career of this monarch; it is therefore surprising that comparatively few Herodian and Jewish coins (N°s 122-134) were found."

- In a private communication, Nancy M. Waggoner, Curator of Greek Coins, The American Numismatic Society, New York, suggests, "I am more inclined to think it might come from a 4th Cen. BC mint in Cilicia, where we do find small denominations, sometimes with Ba'al-tarz seated right, and sometimes winged Pegasus protome; but I cannot find the two in combination with each other."

- PTOLEMAIC**
- Ptolemaic bronzes are notoriously difficult to attribute. Despite the clearcut divisions found in some reports, deciding between mintages of one Ptolemy or another is often impossible. The attributions that follow are conservative.


